

## J CLASS WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS FAQs

**Q: Will NYYC provide spectator boats?**

A: There will be no NYYC provided spectator boats.

**Q: Are there are charters going out to watch?**

A: Many local charters will be running their regular routes that limit them to inside the bay. There is a list of charters available on the J Class Association website.

**Q: Where can we watch from land?**

A: Castle Hill, Gurney's, Brenton Point, Fort Adams or Beavertail are all options to see some of the racing or boats leaving the harbor, weather permitted.

**Q: Where can we watch on the water?**

A: Racing will take place on both the Sound and up the East Passage. The current plan is for 2 days of Coastal racing which will take the fleet up the East Passage towards Gould Island and back down. The other 3 days will be windward-leeward held on a course out on the Sound.

**Q: What does the course look like?**

A: See above.

**Q: What days will they be inside the bay and what days outside?**

A: This decision will be made the night before racing and will depend on the weather and wind forecast.

**Q: When will they start and finish?**

A: The start and finish will be in the vicinity of Beavertail and Castle Hill or approximately 2 miles south of Brenton Point. This will be determined daily based on the wind conditions.

**Q: What VHF Channels should I listen to?**

A: A live broadcast of the racing along with other spectator information will take place on VHF 85 each day. The Race Committee will be on VHF 72.
