Rolex Invitational Cup History

The 2023 Rolex Invitational Cup will be Corinthian Yacht Club's first year participating. CYC's goal is to involve their entire membership throughout the IC campaign. Their 2023 IC campaign is named First Across. The campaign committee is led by two members, Joe and Marissa Fava. CYC's crew will consist of the 2022 Resolute Cup champion team and a summer-long selection process will select the other few crew members.

Crew

The Corinthian Yacht Club's first ever Invitational Cup crew is led by helmsman Wade Waddell from Boston, Mass. Waddell has 20 years of racing experience. A Boston College graduate, he sailed in multiple national championships and received an honorable mention as a college All-American. Waddell helped CYC win the 2021 Morgan Cup as well as the 2022 Resolute Cup. He is a regular on the J/70 circuit in a crew role and was a part of the winning boat in the Corinthian division at the 2022 J/70 North Americans. Doing the tactics for CYC will be Tim Wadlow. A Boston University graduate, 3-time All-American, and the 1997 college Sailor of the Year. Wadlow placed fifth in the 2004 Olympic Games and sixth in the 2008 Games both in the 49er class. Wadlow has been a force in the Team Race circuit, winning the 2005 Team Race World Championship, multiple British-American Cups, and the 2021 Morgan Cup.
